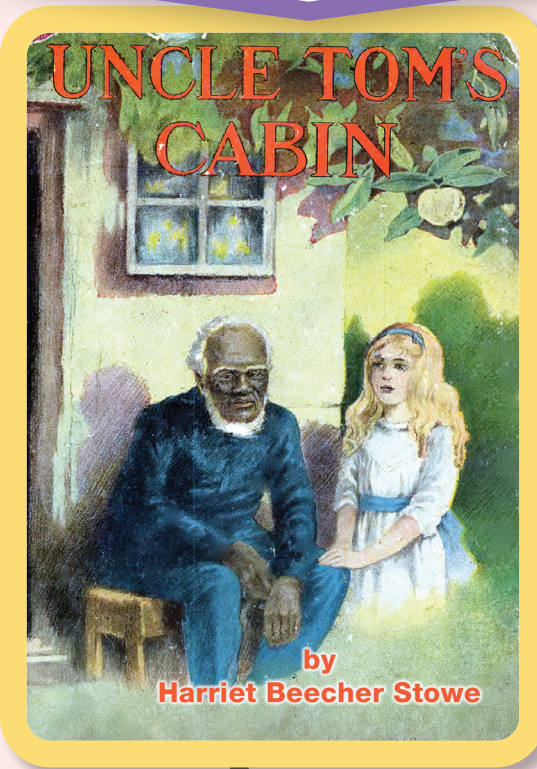


Sojourner Truth

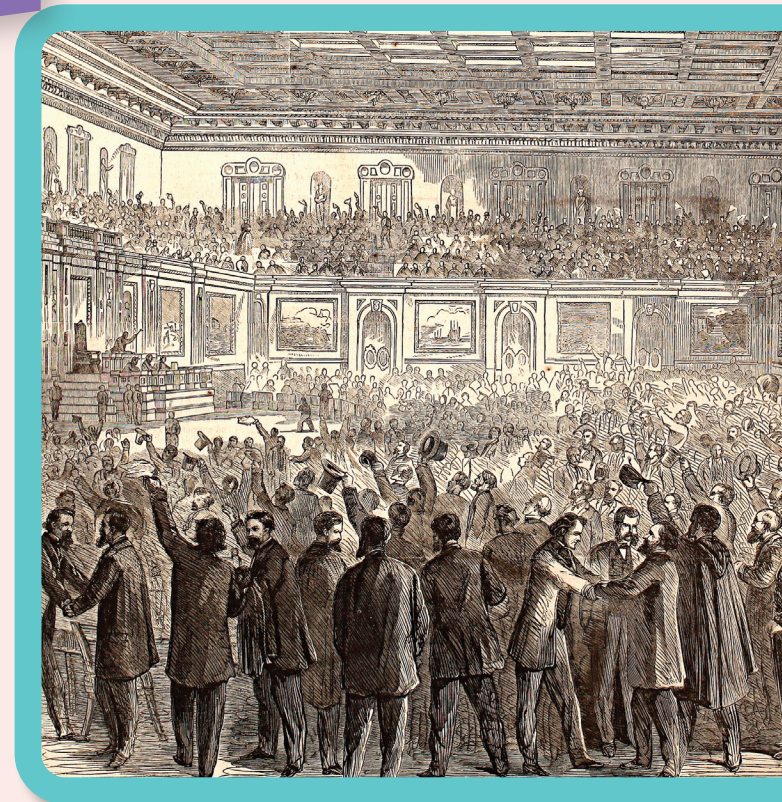
1826

Harriet Beecher Stowe wrote a book against slavery.



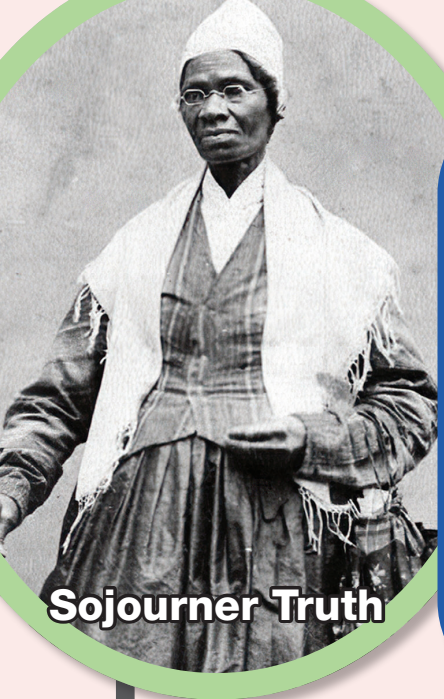
1865

Timeline

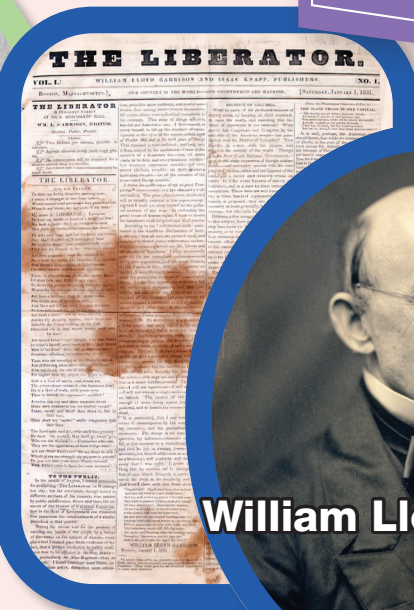


Sojourner Truth

She spoke out against slavery.

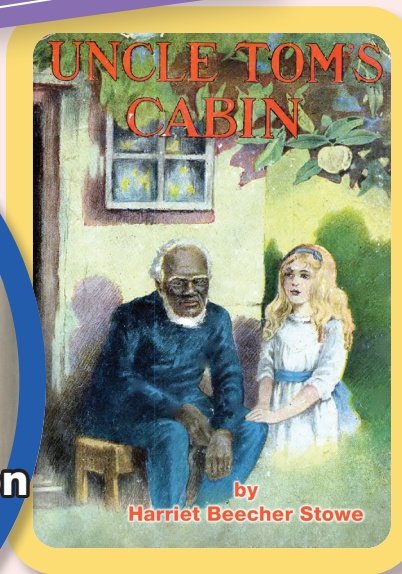


William Lloyd Garrison

This man was an abolitionist.

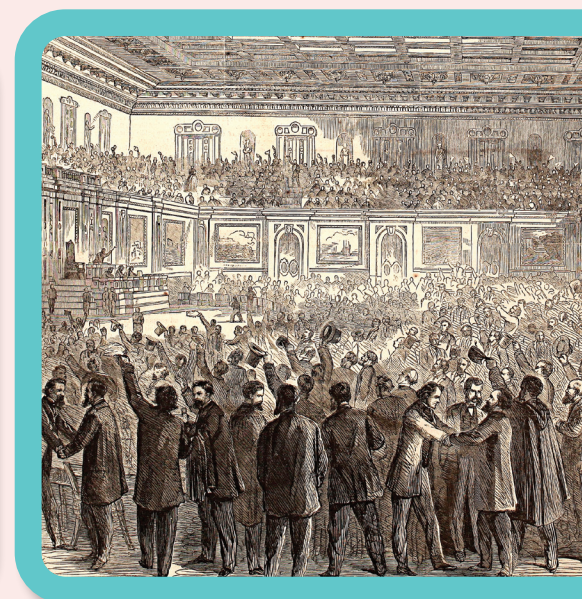
He wrote stories against slavery.

Abolitionists helped enslaved people to escape to freedom.



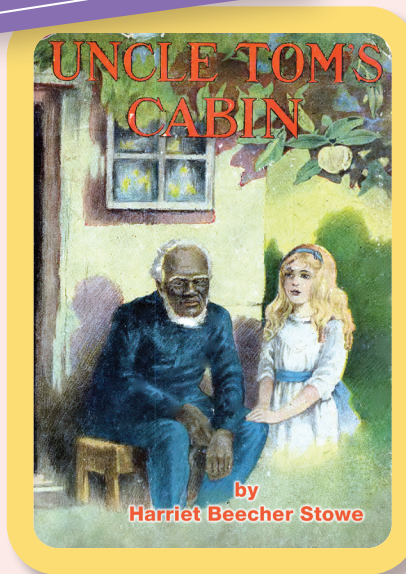
1826

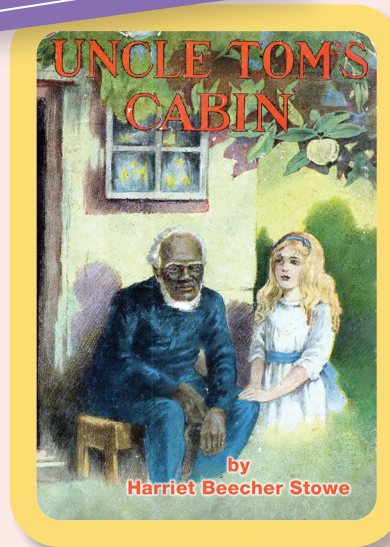
